While others go on holiday, we sharpen our skills. We want to better serve our learners by acquiring the core skills necessary.

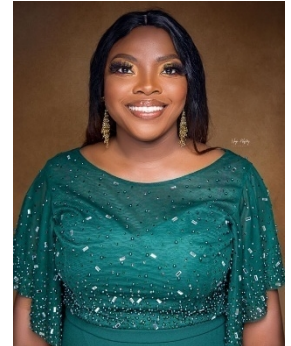
